Joy Says the Pope

Joy is the theme of this Third Sunday of Advent (Luke 3:10-18) and joy is the theme of our Pope's whole pontificate. Remember him calling out "sourpuss" Christians who find fault with everything and everybody (other than themselves of course); folk who can only see doom and gloom in the world around them. In Evangelii Gaudium Pope Francis quotes Pope Saint John 23rd fifty odd years ago at the commencement of the Second Vatican Council (11/10/62):

"At times we have to listen, much to our regret, to the voices of people who, though burning with zeal, lack a sense of discretion and measure. In this modern age they can see nothing but prevarication and ruin ... We feel that we must disagree with those prophets of doom who are always forecasting disaster, as though the end of the world were at hand."

Perhaps this Advent, particularly following the Plenary Council of our Australian Church, the Synod on Synodality and in anticipation of our own Diocesan Assembly, any "sourpusses" can be persuaded to join in the eagerness and excitement of the Lord's coming. Certainly, there are evils in our world and our church but they "must not be excuses for diminishing our commitment and our fervour. Let us look upon them as challenges which

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

What, then, must we do?

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.

There was at this time in the wilderness of Judea a great preacher, John the Baptist. Many people came to hear him and to be baptized.
