Dear Parishioners

What a weekend we are having. Twenty-four children from our parish are we celebrate and live out receiving their First Holy Communion. As a priest I always get excited when it comes to First Holy Communion. I guess that it is hard not to get excited when one can see the excitement of the little ones getting ready for the special day. I wish you all could have participated in the preparation sessions we had for the children. It was such a joy and inspiration to witness their eagerness to receive Jesus. However, when I see children's excitement, I also get overwhelmed at the thought how much Jesus is excited to come to their hearts in Holy Communion. In the Church we have beautifully ornamented ciboria and chalices where we keep the Body and Blood of Christ but Jesus doesn't change bread and wine into his Body and Blood to be kept forever in these sacred vessels. Jesus wants to come to us. He wants to dwell in us. That's why I believe that First Holy Communion celebrations are a parish retreat for all of us to stop and think what we have done with the excitement, love and joy for the Eucharist from our own First Holy Communion. At both Masses this weekend we will have children coming for the first time to fully participate in the Eucharist. As I pray for them and their families I also pray for each of you who come to St Kieran's and St Mary's for Mass so that you may be given grace to love the Eucharist with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength.

A few days ago, I met a relative of a deceased parishioner of ours, the late Rita Whitfort. I was told that that our Parish was an extended family for Rita, that she loved being part of our community where she felt at home. It is how I feel, too, here. I feel that you are my extended Oblate family. Last week Fr Vin reported to me a problem. The problem was that the pamphlets used for Wednesday devotions were so worn out that they were falling apart. I thought to myself: 'How blest we are having such problems. How blest we are that prayer booklets are falling apart from being used so much.' This is one of the things that make me feel at home in our parish. After the pandemic Fr Vin and I discussed that we would like to share with parishioners something that is precious and lifegiving, something that is part of our Oblate daily life. This something is the time of evening prayer and the silent Adoration of the blessed Sacrament which we do every day. This evening prayer and adoration is our family time which we spent together in the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Having it once a week in the church was our way of sharing with you this family moment which we treasure as Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate. How special for Fr Vin and me it has been that we never had to pray the Wednesday Evening Prayer and Adoration alone. There have been aways parishioners joining us. I am so grateful for that.

I assure you of my prayers for you and your families.

RCIA 2025

RCIA stands for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. It may also be referred to as 'the Catechumenate.' It is a process of Christian formation offered to those who seek to become Catholic.

The initiation of new members is a gradual process allowing enquirers time to grow in faith and become full participants of the Catholic community. People undertaking this journey of initiation, unless they have been baptized into another Christian community, are called catechumens. At Easter Vigil they are baptized, confirmed and they receive Holy Communion. If they have been previously baptized, they are called candidates and, while they normally undertake the same formation in the Catholic faith as catechumens, they are initiated into the Church through Confirmation and Eucharist only.

The Diocesan Consultation

The Second Phase of the Diocesan Consultation has been completed in our parish. We held two gatherings - last Sunday after Mass at St Kieran's and last Thursday after morning Mass at St Mary's. It was pleasing to have several groups sharing and discussing the pastoral priorities and action to which we believe the Holy Spirit is calling our parish and Diocese, for the next five years. I am compiling the results of all the groups and these will be submitted to the online Diocesan Consultation portal, to be gathered by the Diocesan Pastoral Team. The fruits of our listening, discussion and contemplation in our parish and across the diocese in parishes, schools and agencies, will form the basis of the agenda for the Diocesan Assembly to be held in February 2025.
