#### Twelve Priorities of the Diocesan Assembly - Sale 2025

The 12 priorities are not numbered according to their importance. Although one may be more urgent and need more focus than the other, all of them are important and meant to be a guiding light as well as missionary destination of the Diocese for next 5 years and more. The second of the priorities is Building Stronger Parish-School Collaboration & Partnership. I would like to give us extracts from the writing of Pope Francis for our reflection that will hopefully encourage us to do our best in building stronger parish-school relationship and collaboration in discipleship and evangelization.

#### 2. Building Stronger Parish-School Collaboration & Partnership

"You are called to develop and transmit a new culture, a new culture, based on the encounter between generations, on inclusion, on the discernment of the true, the good and the beautiful; a culture of responsibility, both personal and collective, to face global challenges such as the environmental, social and economic crises, and the great challenge of peace. At school you can "imagine peace", that is, lay the foundations for a more just and fraternal world, with the contribution of all disciplines and the creativity of children and young people." - Pope Francis, January 2025 to Teachers.

"Dear 2025 Diocesan Assembly Participants, It is nearly three weeks since we were together for the 2025 Diocesan Assembly at Federation University, Churchill. What a wonderful two days we shared together as a Diocesan community!

On behalf of the Animation Team and the Assembly Steering Committee, I want to firstly thank you for your attendance. Quite a number had to make special arrangements to be present on a workday. Thank you to each of you for the sincere, open, respectful, and collaborative way you participated in the process of prayer, listening, and dialogue during the two-days. It was clear from the beginning, you took seriously the invitation to listen attentively to yourselves and others in your table group, with the aim of trying to hear the promptings of the Holy Spirit.

Next week, you will receive the 2025 DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY SUMMARY REPORT . This main part of the report contains a summary of the Table Group feedback to each of the key questions posed in the five working sessions. This report will be helpful not only to you in your conversations with your local communities, but to guide Bishop Greg, and the Diocesan Mission Council, as they begin to draft the Diocesan Pastoral Plan over the coming months. Their first meeting is on Saturday, 22nd March.

Once again, thank you. Keep the spirit of the assembly alive! Pray for us all that we will continue to be led by the Spirit as we work towards helping make our lives and communities Christ centred, synodal and missionary."

Therefore we invite and encourage parishioners celebrating 25<sup>th</sup>, 50<sup>th</sup>, 60<sup>th</sup> or 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of their Catholic Church Wedding to inform the parish office at least three months in advance of their upcoming anniversary. It will give us enough time to organize a special blessing certificate from our Bishop. There is also an opportunity to request a Papal Blessing for such a significant occasion.

### A reading from the book of Deuteronomy

Deuteronomy 26:4-10

Moses said to the people: 'The priest shall take the pannier from your hand and lay it before the altar of the Lord your God. Then, in the sight of the Lord your God, you must make this pronouncement:

"My father was a wandering Aramaean. He went down into Egypt to find refuge there, few in numbers; but there he became a nation, great, mighty, and strong. The Egyptians ill-treated us, they gave us no peace and inflicted harsh slavery on us. But we called on the Lord, the God of our fathers. The Lord heard our voice and saw our misery, our toil and our oppression; and the Lord brought us out of Egypt with mighty hand and outstretched arm, with great terror, and with signs and wonders. He brought us here and gave us this land, a land where milk and honey flow. Here then I bring the first-fruits of the produce of the soil that you, Lord, have given me." # A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke Luke4:1-13

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. Then the devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf.' But Jesus replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone.'

Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, for it has been committed to me and I give it to anyone I choose. Worship me, then, and it shall all be yours.' But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says:

You must worship the Lord your God, and serve him alone."

Then he led him to Jerusalem and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God', he said to him 'throw yourself down from here, for scripture says: He will put his angels in charge of you to guard you, and again: They will hold you up on their hands in case you hurt your foot against a stone."
